

FIRST READING: Isaiah 6:1-8

This reading narrates Isaiah's vision of the Lord surrounded by the angels. They sing "Holy, holy," a song the church sings at the beginning of the great thanksgiving. This liturgical text invites the church and all creation to sing in praise of God's glory.

This glory is God's mercy toward sinners.

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. ²Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. ³And one called to another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts;

the whole earth is full of his glory."

⁴The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. ⁵And I said: "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"


⁶Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. ⁷The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: "Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." ⁸Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!"

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

GOSPEL: John 3:1-17

Jesus' miracles prompt Nicodemus to visit him in secrecy. Jesus tells him about being born of the Spirit and about the Son who has been sent by God to save.

Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. ²He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." ³Jesus answered him, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." ⁴Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" ⁵Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. ⁶What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⁷Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.' ⁸The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." ⁹Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" ¹⁰Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

¹¹"Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. ¹²If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? ¹³No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

¹⁶"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. ¹⁷"Indeed, God did not send the

Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."



SEASON OF CREATION IN JUNE

Our Season of Creation celebration will begin Sunday, June 6 and continue through Sunday, June 20.

<u>The River That Made Seattle</u>, BJ Cummings' very new book is available for your reading in preparation for our June <u>Season of Creation</u>. It is a fascinating story of the early days of Seattle, its indigenous people and relationships with newcomers from the east -- and how the Duwamish River gave life to us all. We expect to have a conversation with Ms. Cummings, and with Duwamish Tribal member James Rasmussen, as part of our "Season"—as well as input from the local Duwamish community. In addition, guest preacher Rev. John Rosenberg will be with us talking about WATERSHEDS from a geological/theological point of view.

ECOTOUR OPPORTUNITY: SEE THE DUWAMISH RIVER SHORELINE

On Saturday, June 12, beginning at 1:00 pm, you are invited to a walking tour along the west side of the Duwamish River. A restoration ecologist will discuss the geographical, cultural, and political history of the river and the impacts on the Duwamish people. TODAY'S COVER ART

Russian Andrei Rublev's 15th century icon (*The Hospitality of Abraham*, or *The Trinity*) shows the Holy One in the form of Three, eating and drinking, in infinite hospitality and utter enjoyment between themselves. The gaze between the Three shows the deep respect between them as they all share from a common bowl. In the icon, the three figures circle a table and the hand of the Spirit points toward the open and fourth place at the table, perhaps pointing to the place where, in the original icon, a mirror may have been. The message: there is a fourth place; a place for you!

"I want you to recognize that this Table is not reserved exclusively for the Three, nor is the divine circle dance a closed circle: we are all invited in. All creation is invited in, and this is the liberation God intended from the very beginning." (Perichoresis is the Greek word for this Trinitarian Dance, from whence our word choreography originates.)
