It is possible to hear in Jesus' high priestly prayer, a prayer he offered shortly before his death, the petitions of the ascended Christ for his own, throughout history—to our day—and beyond.

Jesus prays for us, and these prayers take tangible form when, like Paul and Silas, we are confronted with dangers and challenges that are beyond our ability to "fix."

Walking the Jesus Way in the public square has consequences, as does putting our trust in Christ.



There are 21 candles in the candle boxes that flank the altar table today.

One for each of the 21 people—19 young children and 2 teachers—
who were murdered at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas, on May 24th.

Our liturgy today has been reshaped by these events. It begins with an acknowledgment of our anger and grief at our collective inability to protect our little ones from the violence endemic in our culture, and the need to not accept these violent, evil acts as a status quo.


A LITANY IN RESPONSE TO THE MASSACRE AT ROBB ELEMENTARY SCHOOL¹

- P Through the ages, O Christ, we hear your voice asking: Simon, son of John, do you love me?
- C Yes, Lord, you know that I love you.
- P *Feed my lambs*, you command us. Yet today we grieve for precious lambs, not fed, but slaughtered. For sons and daughters, students, classmates, teachers, whose lives you cherished, whose senseless loss we mourn.
- C Lord, have mercy!
- P Through the ages, O Christ, we hear your voice asking: Simon, son of John, do you love me?
- C Yes, Lord, you know that I love you.
- P *Tend my sheep*, you charge. Yet today your flock is scattered and shattered by a violence so brutal it leaves us feeling helpless, searching in vain for answers.
- C Christ, have mercy!
- P Through the ages, O Christ, we hear your voice asking: Simon, son of John, do you love me?
- C Lord, you know everything, you know that I love you.
- P Yet today our claims of love fall flat and our prayers taste like dust. For we have forsaken our promise to love you with our whole heart and to love our neighbors as we love ourselves.
- C Lord, have mercy!
- P Keep us, O God, from rushing to the language of healing before understanding the fullness of this injury and the depth of this wound.
- C Keep us, O God, from finding solace while others languish in pain.
- P Keep our mouths from uttering prayers that our wills refuse to put into action.
- C Convict us for our indifference and our impotence.
- P Keep us, O God, from accepting this incalculable loss as the new status quo.
- C Move us to stand compassionately with the fallen ones' families and to demand a new day from the powers that be.
- P Lord, have mercy, and hear our prayer.
- C Amen.





FIRST READING: Acts 16:16-34

Those who had enslaved a girl and used her powers to tell fortunes threw Paul and Silas into jail for ordering the spirit to come out of her and consequently ruining their business.

In prison, Paul and Silas bring the good new of the gospel to the jailer and his family.

One day, as we were going to the place of prayer, we met a slave girl who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners a great deal of money by fortune-telling. ¹⁷While she followed Paul and us, she would cry out, "These men are slaves of the Most High God, who proclaim to you a way of salvation." ¹⁸She kept doing this for many days. But Paul, very much annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, "I order you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And it came out that very hour.

¹⁹But when her owners saw that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace before the authorities. ²⁰When they had brought them before the magistrates, they said, "These men are disturbing our city; they are Jews ²¹and are advocating customs that are not lawful for us as Romans to adopt or observe." ²²The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates had them stripped of their clothing and ordered them to be beaten with rods. ²³After they had given them a severe flogging, they threw them into prison and ordered the jailer to keep them securely. ²⁴Following these instructions, he put them in the innermost cell and fastened their feet in the stocks.

²⁵About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them. ²⁶Suddenly there was an earthquake, so violent that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened. ²⁷When the jailer woke up and saw the prison doors wide open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, since he supposed that the prisoners had escaped. ²⁸But Paul shouted in a loud voice, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here." ²⁹The jailer called for lights, and rushing in, he fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. ³⁰Then he brought them outside and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" ³¹They answered, "Believe on the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." ³²They spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. ³³At the same hour of the night he took them and washed their wounds; then he and his entire family were baptized without delay. ³⁴He brought them up into the house and set food before them; and he and his entire household rejoiced that he had become a believer in God.

GOSPEL: John 17:20-26

Jesus prays that the life of his followers will be characterized by an intimate unity of identity with God. To be so identified with God means also to share in God's mission: to proclaim the word that will bring others into this same unity.

[Jesus prayed:] ²⁰"I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, ²¹that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. ²²The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one, ²³I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me. ²⁴Father, I desire that those also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory, which you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world.

²⁵"Righteous Father, the world does not know you, but I know you; and these know that you have sent me. ²⁶I made your name known to them, and I will make it known, so that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them."






