From the beginning God has entrusted the human community with tending and caring for Earth—our common home. In this time of unprecedented threats to the planetary systems that sustain life, we commit ourselves to the vocation of creation care once more. We recognize the interconnectivity and worth of all of God's glorious creation and commit ourselves to care for the land, the air, the water, and the fellow creatures with whom we share this home.

During this year's Season of Creation, we consider all of God's creation as a garden. The Gospel readings assigned for these three Sundays tell about Jesus' ministry to people. How do these readings, then, relate to our garden theme? People are both part of and symbolic of creation. What we experience as humans is also experienced by nature (and vice versa). People are broken and need forgiveness and healing. Likewise, the earth is broken and in need of healing. In John 20:21, Jesus says to his disciples, "As God has sent me, so I send you." Perhaps the original context of this commission can be extended to include us working for restoration of the planet. In doing so, we follow God's original mandate to tend and care for the earth. Created in the image of God, we are **Keepers of the Garden**.






PRAYER OF THE DAY




FORGIVENESS



We believe in Jesus Christ as the revelation and Wisdom of God, joining the web of life as human flesh; Jesus is the love of God immersed in the cosmos.


We believe in an Earth community, a community where lives of all creatures and habitats are interconnected.







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WHAT'S A "P-PATCH"?

It's a very special kind of community garden. A special *Seattle* kind of garden! And this year our city is celebrating its 50th anniversary of our P-Patch community gardens. Seattle's gardens now constitute the largest community gardens west of New York.

In the early 20th century, the Picardo family operated a truck farm in the Wedgwood area of Seattle, producing vegetables for market. Fast forward to 1973 when part of the farm was sold to a community group that developed it into Seattle's *first community garden* -- the *Picardo* Farm P-Patch. So -- not just a "Pea Patch." The Picardo family will forever be remembered as the source.

Since 1973, P-Patch community gardeners have been:

- Growing community
- Nurturing civic engagement
- Practicing organic gardening techniques
- Fostering an environmental ethic and connecting nature to people' lives
- Improving access to local, organic, and culturally appropriate food
- Transforming the appearance and revitalizing the spirit of their neighborhoods
- Developing self-reliance and improving nutrition through education and hand-on experience
- Feeding the hungry
- Preserving heirloom flowers, herbs and vegetables
- Budding understanding between generations and cultures through gardening and cooking

Several P-Patch gardens can be found in West Seattle; maybe Peace folks are current gardeners or have been in the past. The closest to our church neighborhood are located at the tennis courts near Lincoln Park and the Barton Street P-Patch (on 34th Ave SW and Barton). All P-Patch gardens are open to the public to enjoy and are used as restorative spaces, learning and idea incubators, and

gathering spaces. Also, the gardens provide a way to give back to the community through volunteer hours and by supplying fresh, organic produce to Seattle food banks and feeding programs.

So -- take a stroll through one of our community gardens -- P-Patches -- and consider signing up for your own patch. But expect a wait of 1-2 years. They're popular!
