FIRST READING: Acts 2:1-21 (adapted)

Graham Johnson When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly L from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked,

- C Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Norwegians and Finns, Germans and Swedes, Italians, Scots, and Poles;
- People from West Seattle, White Center, and Tukwila; from Rainier Valley to Queen Anne, L South Park to Capitol Hill.
- Folk from Canada and Mexico, from the Midwest and the Far East, С from the islands of Indonesia to the islands of the Salish Sea.
- Asylum-seekers from Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, and Angola; L humanitarian parolees from Afghanistan and Ukraine. Visa holders from Asia and the Pacific, Africa, Latin America, and sojourners from all places in between.
- In our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power. С
- All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, L
- С What does this mean?
- L But others sneered and said,
- "They are filled with new wine." С
- L But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "People of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:
- С 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams.
- L Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day.

PSALM 104

When You Send Forth Your Spirit

The congregation joins the choir on each refrain; singing it through twice each time.

SECOND READING: Romans 8:18-27


Paul expands the reach of God's redemptive power: not the human species alone but the whole of God's creation waits eagerly for the fullness of what God has promised. The Holy Spirit is the first fruit of this future hope, interceding for us and for all creation with sighs too deep for words.

¹⁸I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. ¹⁹For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God; ²⁰for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope ²¹that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. ²²We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; ²³and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? ²⁵But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

²⁶Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. ²⁷And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

GOSPEL: John 15:26-27; 16:4b-15

When speaking to his disciples before his death, Jesus referred to the Holy Spirit as "the Helper" and described the difference the Spirit would make in their lives and in the world.

[Jesus said,] ²⁶"When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf. ²⁷You also are to testify because you have been with me from the beginning.

^{16:4b}"I did not say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you. ⁵But now I am going to him who sent me; yet none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' ⁶But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your hearts. ⁷Nevertheless I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. ⁸And when he comes, he will prove the world wrong about sin and righteousness and judgment: ⁹about sin, because they do not believe in me; ¹⁰about righteousness, because I am going to the Father and you will see me no longer; ¹¹about judgment, because the ruler of this world has been condemned.

¹²"I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. ¹³When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. ¹⁴He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. ¹⁵All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you."

+ THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM +

The candidates, sponsor, and parents gather at the font as the congregation sings verses 1-3 of ELW #448. Pastor Kindem addresses the baptismal group and the congregation, on page 227, ELW.

P God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

PRESENTATION

P Itzel, who do you present for baptism?

Response I present <u>Alex Theo and Owen Dean</u> for baptism.

Pastor Winterstein addresses the parents:

P Christina and Derek, called by the Holy Spirit and trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have your sons baptized into Christ?

Response We do.

- P As you bring *Owen and Alex* to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with gifts and responsibilities:
 - to live with them among God's faithful people,
 - to bring them to the word of God and the holy supper,
 - to teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments,
 - to place in their hands the Holy Scriptures,
 - and to nurture them in faith and prayer, so that they may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made,
 - and work for justice and peace.
- Do you promise to help your sons grow in the Christian faith and life? *Response:* We do.

Pastor Kindem addresses the sponsor:

P Itzel, do you promise to nurture these children in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help them live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Response: I do.

Pastor Kindem addresses the assembly:

P People of God, do you promise to support <u>Alex and Owen</u> and to pray for them in their new life in Christ? If so, answer, "we do."

Response: We do.

RENUNCIATION OF EVIL AND PROFESSION OF FAITH

Pastor Kindem addresses the baptismal party and the congregation:

In baptism God's NO becomes our NO; and God's YES becomes our YES. As we baptize today, and affirm our own baptisms, I ask you to profess your faith in Christ, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God, the powers of this world that rebel against God, and the ways of sin that draw you from God? If so, answer "I renounce them." **Response: I renounce them.**

Addressing the whole assembly: Do you believe in God the Father? I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God? I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord. who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come again to judge the living and the dead. Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

THANKSGIVING AT THE FONT

Pastor Winterstein leads the prayer over the font:

- P The Lord be with you.
- C And also with you.
- P Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- C It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Assistants pour water into the font during the thanksgiving.

P Blessed are you, holy God.

You are the creator of the waters of Earth.

You are the fire of rebirth.

You poured out your Spirit on your people on Pentecost.

You breathe life into our dry bones.

Your Son Jesus promised to send the Spirit to us

that the world may know your peace and truth.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, and breathe new life into those who are here baptized. By your Spirit adopt us all as your children, through our savior Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

The pastors, baptism group, and community lay hands on Alex and Owen as a sign of blessing.

- P Let us pray. We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your sons and daughters new birth, wash them from sin, and raise them to eternal life. Sustain <u>Owen and Alex</u> with the gift of your Holy Spirit:
 - the spirit of wisdom and understanding,
 - the spirit of counsel and might,
 - the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord,
 - the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever. Amen.

SIGNING WITH THE CROSS AND ANOINTING

Owen and Alex are anointed with oil and given the sign of the cross.

- P <u>Alex/Owen</u>, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.
- C Amen.

PRESENTATION OF A CANDLE

The assisting minister presents a lighted candle to the newly baptized.

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




