

READING: Ezekiel 17:22-24

Tree imagery is used in a messianic prophecy to tell how the Lord will choose someone from Judah's royal family (the cedar tree) to reign over all creation. This tree will be planted on God's holy mountain. The cedar tree is also a sacred blessing to Salish and other Tribal communities throughout the Northwest for all that it provides that sustains life and enables it to flourish.

²²Thus says the LORD GOD: I myself will take a sprig from the lofty top of a cedar; I will set it out. I will break off a tender one from the topmost of its young twigs; I myself will plant it on a high and lofty mountain. ²³On the mountain height of Israel I will plant it, in order that it may produce boughs and bear fruit, and become a noble cedar.

Under it every kind of bird will live; in the shade of its branches will nest winged creatures of every kind. ²⁴All the trees of the field shall know that I am the LORD. I bring low the high tree, I make high the low tree; I dry up the green tree and make the dry tree flourish. I the LORD have spoken; I will accomplish it.



GOSPEL: Mark 4:26-34

Jesus frequently uses parables to teach ordinary people as they are able to hear and understand.

Images of sowing and growing show the vitality of God's kingdom.

His use of the mustard seed provides a surprising and unexpected twist.

²⁶[Jesus said], "The kingdom of God is as if someone would scatter seed on the ground, ²⁷and would sleep and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and grow, he does not know how. ²⁸The earth produces of itself, first the stalk, then the head, then the full grain in the head. ²⁹But when the grain is ripe, at once he goes in with his sickle, because the harvest has come."

³⁰He also said, "With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it? ³¹It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; ³²yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade."

³³With many such parables he spoke the word to them, as they were able to hear it; ³⁴he did not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything in private to his disciples.







- C Thanks be to God!


DISTRIBUTION



THIS WEEK'S ACT FOR CREATION

Protect our watershed by cleaning up after your dog. Only 40% of dog owners do! America has about 72 million pet dogs. Worldwide, around 40 MILLION tons of dog poop is left behind every year, and that's bad. Dog poop: 1) can contain parasites that may transfer to native wildlife, like squirrels and birds, and up to 23 million fecal bacteria in a single gram of waste; 2) is among the top five contributors of bacteria in contaminated water; and 3) was categorized by the EPA, in the early 90s, an environmental pollutant on the same level as pesticides! So please, stoop and scoop.
